

## DPA L72 – Existing Conditions Overview

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### Section 106 Resources

- There are **no** National Historic Trails that intersect the DPA

  - o Pawnee Nation of Oklahoma

### Biological Resources

- Federally Listed Species Range
  - o Monarch Butterfly – Proposed Threatened
  - o Piping Plover – Threatened
  - o Regal Fritillary – Proposed Threatened
  - o Whooping Crane – Endangered
- State Listed Species Range
  - o Interior Least Tern – Endangered
  - o Northern Long-Eared Bat – Endangered
  - o Piping Plover – Threatened
  - o Whooping Crane – Endangered

- Plum Creek Park Lake is **not** a 303d water body
- Dawson County Museum Lake is **not** a 303d water body
- The DPA has one Wellhead Protection Areas
  - City of Lexington (NE3104708)
