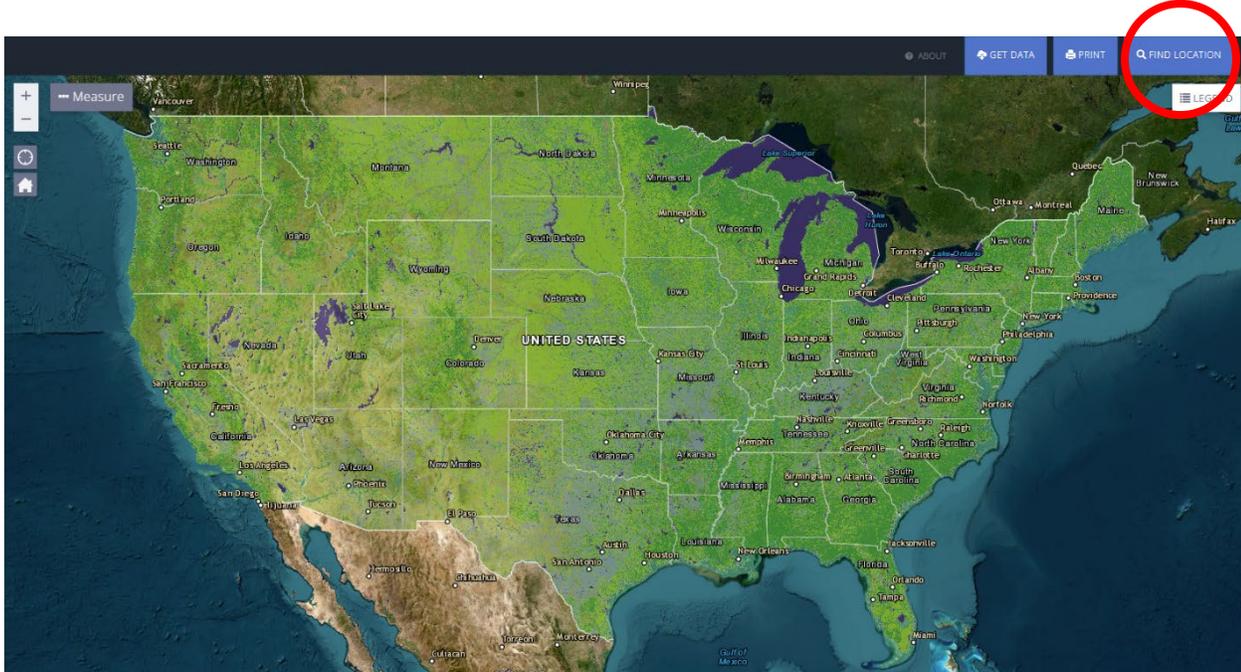

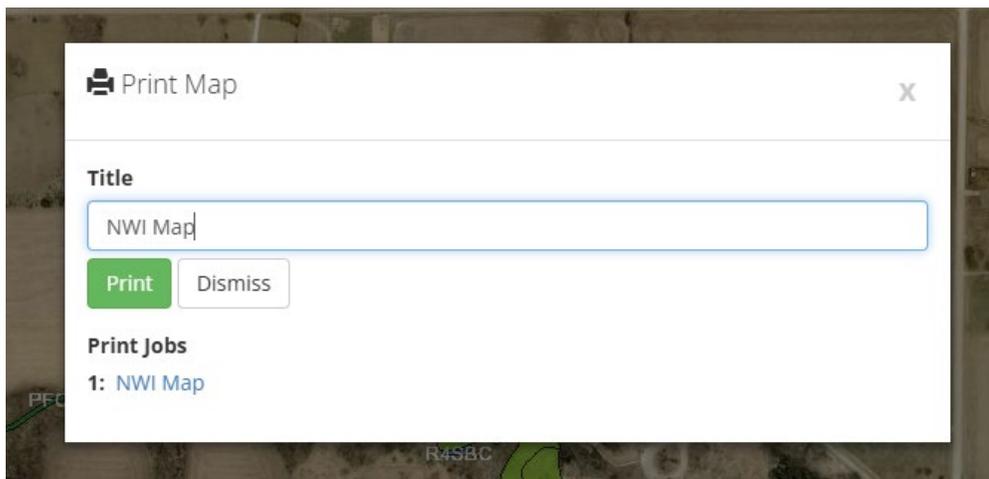

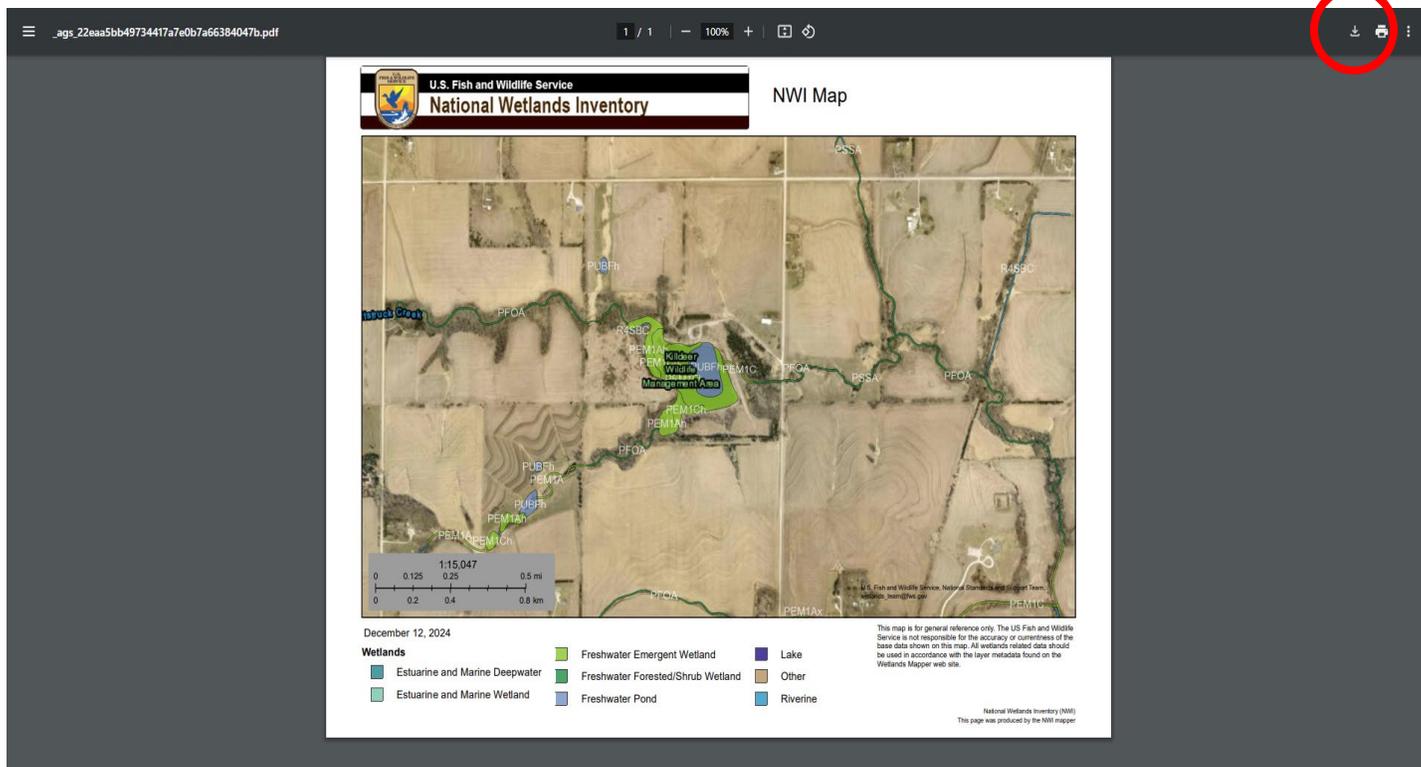
1. Open the National Wetlands Inventory Wetlands Mapper. Zoom into the project area on the map or enter an address, city, or coordinates in the **Find Location** tab in the upper right corner.



2. Once your project area has been located on the map, select the **Print** tab in the upper right corner, next to the **Find Location** tab. Create a title for your map, then press the green **Print** button. Your map should pop up underneath **Print Jobs**.



- Click on your map's name under **Print Jobs**. This should open another browser tab. From here, you can save your NWI map into your desired folder.



*Features on the NWI map can be difficult to see if a large area is selected. Some project areas may need multiple maps to sufficiently portray all features.
