## Section 106 Project Review Form

- Open the Online NeSHPO Section 106 Project Review Form from the Nebraska State Historical Society website (linked above).
- The document will need to be downloaded in order to complete the form. The document MUST be opened with a pdf reader (i.e. Adobe, Bluebeam, etc.) in order to fill out the form digitally.
  - If the document is opened with a web browser, you will not be able to fill it out digitally.
- **Section I. Project Status**
  - Select the option: **Federal Undertaking Established**
- **Section II. Project Submission**
  - Fill out the Project Name: **NBEAD Assigned Unique Project Name**
  - Agency Project No.: **N/A**
  - Nearest City/Town: **As applicable**
  - County: **As applicable**
  - Location: **Include Lat/Long and General Project Location**
  - Certified Local Government: **Select from menu as applicable**

- **Section III. Project Submission**
  - A) Project Type
    - Select the option(s) that best describes your project. If none of the pre-determined options fit, select other and explain.

      - Spatial Data Files (e.g., KMZ, .SHP)
- **Section IV. Project Description**
  - A) Ground Disturbing Activities

➤ **Section V. Identification of Historic Properties: Archeology**


- A) Has a cultural resource survey been completed within the APE?
  - **Answer is likely No.**
- B) Is the landowner aware of any archeological resources identified within the APE?
  - **If above answer is “No”, can answer with N/A.**

➤ **Section IV. Identification of Historic Properties: Standing Structures**

- A) Are there any buildings or structures 50 years or older within the APE?
  - Utilize the National Register of Historic Places website found [here](#) to identify if an existing historical resource or district exists within the project area.
  - Once the website opens, either zoom to the project area or utilize the search bar in the upper right corner to find a specific location.



- When the project area is located, note if an orange dot is present (this represents a historical structure) or if an orange polygon is present (this represents a historical district). If both are not present within the project area, no historical properties are present. A red dot represents a resource that has been removed from the listing.



- If a dot or polygon is present, click on it to open information about the structure or district.
