- There are **no** National Historic Trails that intersect the DPA

Biological Resources

- Federally Listed Species Range

- State Listed Species Range
 - o Interior Least Tern – Endangered
 - o Northern Long-Eared Bat – Endangered
 - o Piping Plover – Threatened
 - o Whooping Crane – Endangered

- Wood River is 303d listed, impaired for Aesthetics (odor), agricultural water supply (Sp. Con.), and Aquatic life (ammonia, chloride, dissolved oxygen)
