  - o Impaired for aquatic life, caused by oxygen depletion and pesticides
  - o Impaired for recreation use, caused by pathogens
- Cook Creek is a 303d water body
  - o Impaired for recreation use, caused by pathogens
- Methodist Creek is a 303d water body
  - o Impaired for recreation use, caused by pathogens
- Harlan County Reservoir is a 303d water body
  - o Impaired for aquatic life, caused by algal growth and nutrients
