- There is one Wellhead Protection Area within the DPA
  - o City of Chadron (NE3104507)

  - o Bordeaux WMA
  - o Chadron State Park
- There are four Federal Real Properties within the DPA
- There is USFS property within the DPA
  - o Nebraska National Forest
