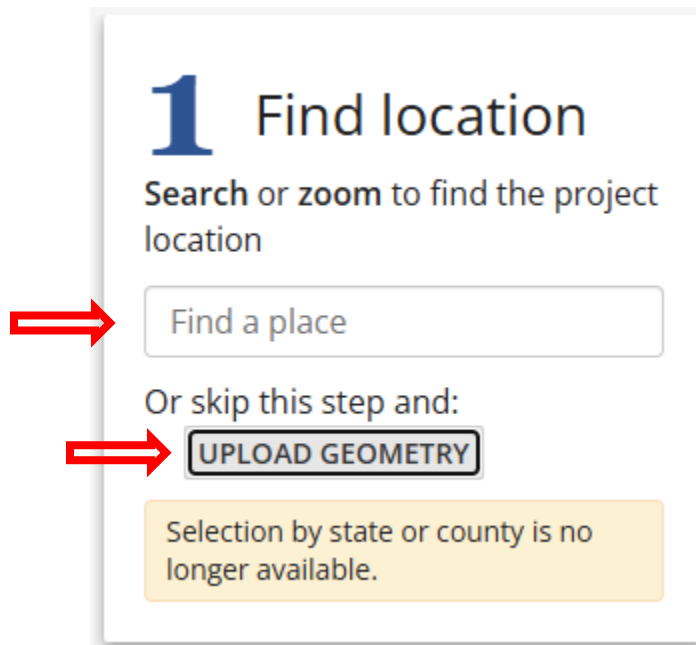

1. Open the Information for Planning and Consultation and select **Get Started**.
2. There are two options to upload the project area: **Find location** or **Define area**.

Find location

- Under **Find location**, enter the project location in the search bar or select **Upload Geometry** if you have an applicable shapefile for the project area.



Define area

- Under **Define area**, zoom to the general area of the project on the map. Select one of the tools (**Sketch**, **Polygon**, or **Line**) then draw in the project area, or select **Upload Geometry** if you have an applicable shapefile for the project area.


Modify the shape by clicking and dragging the vertices or clicking on a solid vertex to remove it

4. This will take you to a new page. On this page, select **Print Resource List** on the left side of the screen.

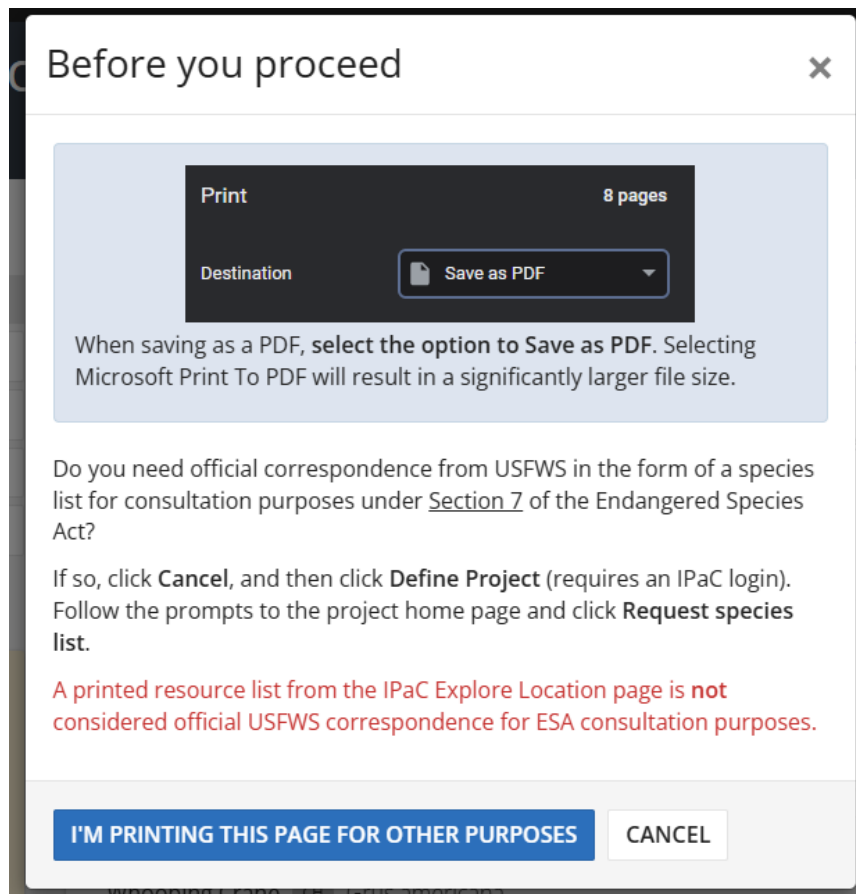

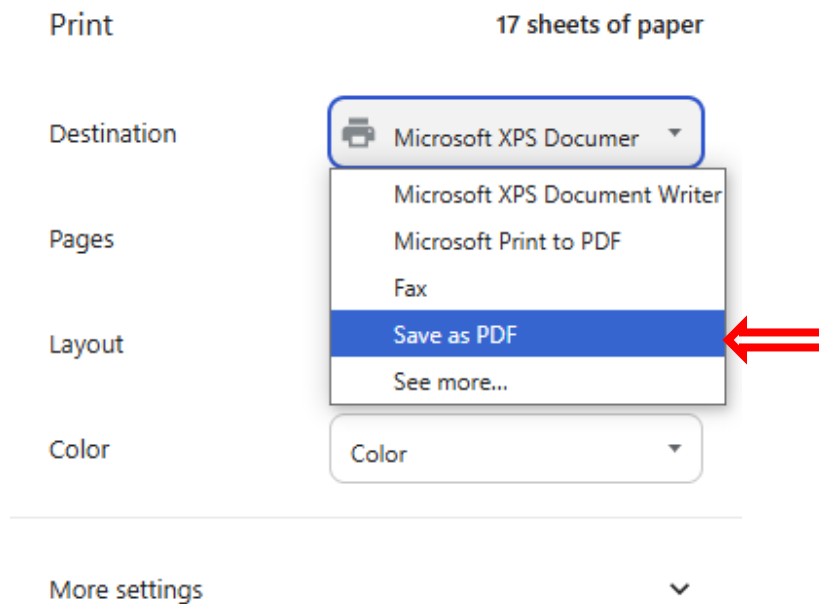
