


- Digital Equity the competencies and skills required for navigating digital literacy skills
- Digital Literacy Skills the framework identifies six categories of skills:
 - real-time thinking,
 - reproduction thinking,
 - information thinking,
 - social-emotional thinking,
 - o photo-visual thinking, and
 - branching thinking
- Digital Inclusion the activities that are necessary to ensure that all individuals in the United States have access to, and the use of, affordable information and communication technologies
- Digital Literacy the skills associated with using technology to enable users to find, evaluate, organize, create, and communicate information
- Covered populations individual who fall into one of the identified populations (see right)
- Community Anchor Institution any nonprofit or governmental community support organization such as public schools, a public or multi-family housing authority, libraries, medical or healthcare provider, institutions of higher education

Covered Populations

There are eight covered populations identified by National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA). The DE Plan must address all covered populations, but can prioritize goals.

- Low income
- Incarcerated
- Rural
- Disabled
- Veterans
- Older
- Racial ethnic minority & Native American
- Limited English Proficiency/low literacy
