    - Impaired for aquatic life, caused by algal growth, nutrients, ph acidity caustic conditions
  - Fremont Lake No. 20 (SRA) is a 303d water body
    - o Impaired for aquatic life, caused by algal growth, mercury, nutrients
  - The DPA has five Wellhead Protection Areas
