- Republican River is a 303d water body
 - Impaired for aquatic life, caused by nutrients, metals other than mercury, radiation, cause unknown impaired biota
 - Impaired for drinking water use, caused by pathogens
 - Impaired for recreation use, caused be pathogens
- Lost Creek is a 303d water body
 - Impaired for aquatic life, caused by oxygen depletion
 - Impaired for recreation use, caused be pathogens
- Spring Creek is a 303d water body
 - Impaired for aquatic life, cause unknown
- Little Blue River is **not** a 303d water body
 - o Impaired for recreation use, caused be pathogens
- Crystal Lake (SRA) is a 303d water body
 - Impaired for aquatic life, caused by algal growth, nutrients, oxygen depletion, pH acidity caustic conditions
- The DPA has three Wellhead Protection Areas
 - Village of Deweese (NE3120030)
 - Village of Rushkin (NE3112905)
 - City of Superior (NE3112904)
